





My second rotation is in Laundry. I fold clothes and make sure none of them have stains. If they have stains, they need to be washed again so I put them into another pile. I also use the industrial folding machine: Sparky. It is an automatic folding machine. I put laundry into the mouth of Sparky and make sure that it does not get jammed up. They need cloths, towels, and blankets to take care of the patient's health and cleanliness.





My second rotation is in Materials Management. I have been stocking materials and organizing. I also deliver items to hospital departments. I follow a pick list to know what items departments need. My favorite part in this rotation is stocking shelves because it feels good to get inventory in the right order. This could help me obtain a future job that needs stocking and organizing.

My second rotation is in Day Surgery. I am cleaning and stocking rooms. I also make coffee and stock blankets in the blanket warmer. Making beds and keeping linens in the cabinet are a part of my job too.

My favorite part of Day Surgery is Everything! If there is a job cleaning beds and stocking, I can do it.



My second rotation is in the Behavioral Health department. There, I've worked as an office clerk handling official documents as well as running errands to and from the hospital like retrieving lab results. I've participated in community meetings and volunteered at community events like Homeless Connect on behalf of the Behavioral Health department. My favorite things about working in Behavioral Health are the great people I work with and the positive impact I have on my community.
